Our campus has a goal of being Zero Waste by 2025.

CSUSM currently has 129 courses that integrate sustainability themes and concepts into the curriculum.





The Sustainable Food Project Garden, Cougar Pantry, and fresh fruit trees on campus are initiatives put in place to reduce food insecurity.







In 2023, we diverted 775 lbs of food, 8450 lbs of Goodwill items, 818 lbs of kitchen re-use items, and 531 lbs of clothes through the Move Out Program!

Get around town and to campus via the SPRINTER, Breeze bus, carpool, bike / e-bike, zipcar, and more.



### **Incorporate meatless meals**

Participate in Meatless Monday to save 133 gallons of water and 8 pounds of carbon each week.

- Is it necessary? Can I borrow it?
- What is the lifecycle of the item?
- How was it made and how does it get disposed?






## ZERO WASTE ON CAMPUS

An important way to make an impact and achieve our goal of Zero Waste by 2025 is to properly sort waste on campus. This entails putting food scraps and soiled paper in the compost, recyclable cardboard, plastic, and aluminum in the recycling, and other



items in the landfill.



Did you know that you can recycle soft plastics and plastic films from campus? We partnered with a company that turns soft plastics into decking material through Trex. You can recycle plastic wrap, plastic bags, and other items like bubble wrap in yellow bins on campus. Learn more **here**.
