- Students in the nursing major must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0.
- With the exception of NURS 490 and 491, all courses used for the major and preparation for the major must be completed with a grade of C (2.0) or higher.
- If a student does not meet GPA requirements, a course may be repeated once with consent of the re-enrollment committee, but only on a space-available basis. Only one course repeat is permitted to continue in the program.
- Students in the nursing major must maintain good academic standing. Students on academic notice are not permitted to enroll in a nursing course until academic notice has been removed.
- In the junior year, NURS 389: Junior Level Nursing Externship is an option.
